After two pre-season losses to Henry Ford II and Romeo, the Stevenson JV-B soccer team earned their first win against Grosse Pointe South on Tuesday. Even though there are only four sophomore players on the team, they all played major roles in the victory.

The Titans won 4-1 with goals from four freshmen (Adam Khanfar, Andrew Bajeu, Hayden Peterson and Savyo Krikor). Sophomore co-captain Hussein Elzhenni was credited with assists on three of the four of the goals.

On the defensive end of the field, the other three sophomore players were key to stopping the GPS scoring. Goalkeeper Anton Shemshur held GPS scoreless until very late in the game, aided by excellent defense, which was led by Co-captain Evan Barash and Will Schwesinger.

### Attention Junior and Senior Ladies Interested in Playing Powderpuff

Our Powderpuff game is on Tuesday, October 10 (juniors vs seniors) and Tuesday, October 17 (Stevenson seniors vs Ford seniors). Forms can be picked up in A10 beginning Thursday, Sept 7. The forms will be on the black filing cabinet next to the door. Sign-ups are Monday the 11 through Thursday the 15 in A10 before school from 6:50-7:15. The cost is \$40, which includes your jersey and your mouth guard. You must have a physical on file in order to play, but this is not needed to sign up. #### Vaping or possession of Vape equipment may lead to 10-day suspension

Vaping or possession of Vape equipment is a violation of District Policy. Studies by the FDA have determined that e-cigarettes and similar devices can increase nicotine addiction and can contain chemicals known to be harmful to human health. The City of Sterling Heights has an ordinance prohibiting the possession of such devices by persons under the age of 18. Regardless of age, students in possession of said devices face school discipline. In addition, students under the age of 18 face a \$500 fine from the City of Sterling Heights. The ordinance also has provisions for possible fines for the parent or guardian.

In addition to rules against tobacco or nicotine devices, Vaping equipment may result in a ten-day suspension under the District's ban against drug paraphernalia. Since vape equipment can be used to ingest drugs other than nicotine, the equipment can be defined as drug paraphernalia.


Please help us keep the building Vape free and our students healthy by talking to your student about the dangers of vaping and encouraging them to not possess or use Vape equipment especially in school.
