**June 9- Graduation @ "O-Rena" at Oakland University @ 11:00 a.m.**

Class of 2020 students are guaranteed a parking permit if they purchase it by the end of Senior Titan Day. Seniors can pay to hold a parking permit if they have a learners permit (See note on September 3 to 6) and plan to complete the training before the end of the school year. Parking permits cost \$45 dollars, if lost the cost to replace is \$80. Permits will go up to \$50 the second week of school. We are currently only honoring purchase requests of seniors. If after senior sales, we still have permits available, we will open to juniors based on attendance (the best attendance gets first priority). *At this time, we do not plan on accepting sophomore applications.*

All applicants must read the rules for parking which you can find by clicking [here](#). All spring applicants can find their applications [here](#). All other applications will become available online in early August.

*May 28 - June 14 2018-19 Class of 2020 with current parking permits*

Juniors with current parking permits may trade in their 2018-2019 permit and receive \$5 off the 2019-2020 permit. Please see Mrs. Suvak in the AP office with your completed application, payment, all required copies, and your 2018-2019 permit. You will be given your 2019-2020 permit and can begin using it for the remainder of the school year.

*June 3 – June 14 2018-19 Class of 2020 without current parking permits*

Juniors who are purchasing a permit for the first time please see Mrs. Suvak in the AP office with their completed application, payment, and all required copies. You will be given your 2019-2020 permit and may begin using it to park for the remainder of this school year.

*June 14 – June 21 2019-2020 Class of 2020*

This year's juniors become Seniors on June 15. Seniors who want to secure their permit for next year can come in to see Mrs. Suvak by June 21 with their completed application, payment, and all required copies. You will be given your 2019-2020 permit.

*Titan Days – Class of 2020 with driver's license last chance for guaranteed parking permit*

Titan Days is the last chance for Seniors to purchase a guaranteed permit. Seniors can purchase their parking permit for \$45 at Titan Days if they bring in a completed application, payment, and all required copies. Failure to purchase by the end of Senior Titan Day means seniors will go on the wait list with junior permit applications that are distributed based on attendance (priority given to best attendance regardless of grade). Seniors are not guaranteed a permit after Titan Days.

*September 3 – 6 2019-2020 Seniors with learner's permit.*

Seniors with a learner's permit may pay for and reserve a guaranteed parking permit. When the student receives their license, they must bring a photocopy to Mrs. Suvak and the student will receive their permit. No refunds for reserved parking permits that are not picked up.

*September 4 – 6 Junior and Senior Waitlist Applications accepted permits \$45.*

Juniors and Seniors, who failed to apply before, may apply for parking permits. All students that submit applications by September 6 will be given priority based on attendance for a \$45 parking permit.

Juniors with a learner's permit may request to reserve a parking permit. If they make the cut based on attendance, they will have to pay to hold their parking permit. When the student receives their license, they must bring a photocopy to Mrs. Suvak and the student will receive their permit. There are no refunds for parking permits that are not picked up.

*September 9 – September 27 Applications to be placed on the late waitlist to purchase a permit for \$50.*

Juniors and Seniors who failed to apply by September 6 can still apply to be on the waitlist. No Learner Permit applications will be accepted, all learner permit applications must be turned in by September 6.

***Parking Permits sell out every year so please consider all your student's activities for the school year and purchase or reserving a permit early.***

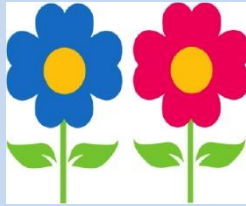
